James Cagney, 86, dies at his farm

STANFORDVILLE, N.Y. - James Cagney, who won fame with his por-trayal of snarling gangsters but earned an Oscar as a jaunty hoofer, died yesterday at the farmhouse he loved in upstate New York. He was

"We were getting him ready for breakfast and he just closed his eyes and went to sleep," said his managerconfidante, Marge Zimmermann, who was present with her husband and Cagney's wife of 64 years, Willy.

Cagney died at 8:05 a.m. He had returned to the farm after being released last week from Lenox Hill Hospital in New York, where he was treated for heart trouble and diabetes.

Funeral arrangements were

incomplete.

President Reagan, a friend, called Cagney "a classic American success story" who "was the best at whatever he did — a hero, a villain, a comic or a dancer." "Nancy and I have lost a dear

friend of many years today and America has lost one of her finest artists. Jimmy burst upon our movie screen with an energy and a talent we have never seen before and will never

see again." A shaken Bob Hope, reached at his home in Palm Springs, Calif., said, "We worked together on 'The Seven Little Foys' and knew each other for about 50 years. I'd be selfish to say I'm going to miss him, because the whole world's going to miss him."

Cagney's acting career spanned seven decades, beginning on Broadway in the 1920s.

Stardom came with his fifth film, "Public Enemy," in 1931, in which he dodged live ammunition — no special effects in those days - and shoved half a grapefruit into the face of Mae

For much of the next two decades. he was one of Hollywood's top box office attractions. When he went into restaurants, diners often sent grapefruit to his table.

He was not limited to criminal roles. He played Bottom in "A Midsummer Night's Dream," a blinded prizefighter in "City for Conquest" and a newspaperman wrongly jailedin "Each Dawn I Die."

His favorite movie - and the only one he would watch when it was shown on television years later — was "Yankee Doodle Dandy" in 1942,

His deaths on screen were as memorable as his dance in "Yankee Doo-dle": He staggered mortally wounded up snow-covered church steps in "The Roaring Twenties"; screamed at the sight of the electric chair in "Angels With Dirty Faces"; fell dead into his mother's house wrapped like a mummy in "Public Enemy"; and was con-sumed in an inferno in "White Heat,"

Financial security stemming from childhood poverty pushed him to give his all in each performance. He won two other Oscar nominations, for 'Angels With Dirty Faces" and for "Love Me or Leave Me."

Cagney also shared billing with a younger actor, Ronald Reagan, in "Boy Meets Girl" in 1938. They were friends ever after. Both were presidents of the Screen Actors Guild and both described themselves as Roosevelt Democrats who turned conservative, at about the same time.

In 1984, Reagan presented the Medal of Freedom to his old friend. After 70 films, he retired in 1961 but returned to the movie world in 1981-to portray a police chief in "Ragtime." His last role was in the CBS television movie "Terrible Joe Moran," filmed in 1983 and broadcast in March 1984.

His fame endured long after his retirement and he was a favorite of mimics, although he said he never uttered the trademark line, "You dirty rat!"

Cagney was born in New York on July 17, 1899, the son of an Irish tender and an Irish-Norwegian make er. He grew up on the tough East Sine. He was a bellhop, waiter, wrapper in a department store, broker's he and chorus boy before settling on
