Dr. G.W. Spicer Succumbs at 82

CHARLOTTESVILLE — Dr. George Washington Spicer, a political science professor at the University of Virginia for 40 years until his retirement in 1968, died Sunday. He was 82. Dr. Spicer began his teaching career at Randolph-Macon Academy in Front Royal in 1920. He taught government and political science at the College of William and Mary from 1923 until he joined the U.Va. faculty in 1928 as acting professor of political science. In 1930, he was named as associate professor and in 1938 to the rank of professor. During 1966-67, he was chairman of the department, and on his retirement the next year, Dr. Spicer was elected to the honorary post of professor emeritus.

The native of Flint Hill in Rappahannock County received his bachelor's degree from Randolph-Macon College and his doctorate from Johns Hopkins University. He was a member of Phi Beta Kappa and the Raven Society. A specialist in U.S. government and constitutional law, Dr. Spicer was the author of four books, including "The Supreme Court and Fundamental Freedoms," published in 1959 with a second edition in 1967. Through the years, he served as a member of and consultant to several government agencies and groups. He was chairman of the Virginia Commission on County Government from 1932 to 1938. He was a consultant to the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights in 1959. In 1951, he was elected president of the Southern Political Science Association. He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Leone Reeves Spicer, a brother, Leonard Spicer of Takoma Park, Md., and a sister, Mrs. Margaret S. Cribb of Takoma Park.
