Mrs. Priscilla Page Stowe, widow of the late Joseph Stowe, mother of Mrs. Wm. Pike, of Lamartine, Wm. P. Stowe, D.D., George E. Stowe, of Harvey, Ill., and Franklin M. Stowe, of Winneconne, and step-mother of Lyman F. Stowe, of this city, died at Lamartine on Sunday the 27th inst., in the 92d year of her age. She settled in the west part of Fond du Lac county, in 1844, and came to the village in 1849. She was a member of the first Methodist Church organized in Fond du Lac. The funeral services were held at the house of Wm. Pike, Lamartine, on Tuesday, May 29, at 2 p. m.
