WHEREAS Thomas Dakan, of Taylor County Iowa,

has deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE of the United States, a Certificate of the REGISTER OF THE LAND OFFICE, at Hannesville, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said

Thomas Dakan, according to the provisions of the

Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for

the West half of the North West quarter, and the South West quarter of the South West quarter, of Section seven, in Township sixty seven North, of Range thirty five West, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Hannesville, Iowa, containing one hundred and ten acres, and twelve hundredths of an acre,

according to the official plat of the Survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said tract has been purchased by the said Thomas Dakan,

NOW KNOW YE, That the

United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DO GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said Thomas Dakan,

and to his heirs, the said tract above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said

Thomas Dakan, and to his heirs and assigns forever.
